1. THE CHAIRMAN'S OPENING REMARKS

The Chairman thanked everyone for coming to the meeting the last one for 2018 and welcomed our new Councillor, Nigel Enderby. Both the Remembrance Day Roll of Honour and the Tree Lighting Ceremony was a great success.

3. ACCEPT AND SIGN THE MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting held on 1st November 2018 were accepted as a true and accurate record, this was proposed by Cllr D Goodrham, seconded by Cllr D Frost and all agreed. The Chairman signed the minutes.

4. TO RECEIVE DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Cllr J Marston and Cllr S Eyres declared an interest in items 6.10.

5. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

None.

6. MATTERS ARISING

6.1 Outstanding Highway Matters

- Pig Sty Lane ditch and footbridge This has been included within a list of items which need to be completed around the village and sent through to the Highway Rangers who are due to come to Mundford in the New Year.
- Highways have been working through our current list of enquiries and only a few remain outstanding.

6.2 Village Footpaths and Verges – to discuss outstanding matters and actions taken

- 44 The Lamas the hedge has now been cut back.
- Rosemary Cottage all works now completed.
- Culford House hedge is overgrown and sharp thorns are present due to rose bush. Chairman J Musgrove will speak to the owner.
- East Hall a pipe has been fractured due to recent works and this is due to be completed.

6.3 Allotments – to discuss (if any) outstanding or future matters

Two allotments are still available.

6.4 Handyman/Gardener – update on outstanding and future projects

The water containers are £30 each and two will be required. They will need to be picked up near Red Lodge and this will cost around £10 - £20 for transportation. There is currently a storage issue for items such as the strimmer, jet wash and gritter. The recently reroofed brick building could be divided with brick wall and secure door for storage. Costing to be established and will be discussed at next meeting.

6.5 History of Mundford Book - update

We are still awaiting delivery of the book due to an issue with the printing. Six books are currently on hold. (13/12/18 - books are now available to purchase from the Parish Office).

6.6 Village Notice Board

The costing for a new notice board is around £1,450. The Council will look into getting a possible lottery grant towards the cost of a new one. If a new board is erected then permission is required by the current owner of the land.

6.7 Tree Planting for 100th Anniversary

A multi-stemmed birch tree will cost around £250 but a single birch or liquid amber tree will cost around £30 each. There are two possible locations the trees can be planted. It was agreed that the multi-stemmed birch can withstand the colder months and shed less leaves. This was proposed by Cllr S Eyres and seconded by Cllr D Fox and all agreed. Cllr S Eyres would like to purchase a flag pole and British Legion poppy flag. Chairman J Musgrove will investigate. Cllr S Eyres would like to change the current bin to a universal bin and move its location. Chairman J Musgrove to investigate exact costings and size required.

6.8 Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony

Thanks to everyone who got involved in the ceremony as this was a great success. Special thanks to the Choir and Father Christmas. Our thanks must also go to the following for their support in raising money for Charity:

- The Crown for the mulled wine and mince pies etc. This raised £145.50 for the Air Ambulance.
- Yallops Butchers for the hot dogs stall. This raised £73.40 for the Parkinsons Charity.
- Mundford Fish Bar for the cakes stall. This raised £50.00 for the East Anglia Childrens Hospice.
- The Parish Council hot chocolate drink stand raised £50.00 for Cancer Research.
- We would also like to thank Lynford Court Care Home and Lynford Hall for their participation.

6.9 Bus Shelter – bill sticking signs

The signs will be 500mm long and 60mm high and contain the words 'No Bill Sticking'. Cllr S Eyres will also look into costing for a new plaque for the rose bed.

6.10 The Cricket Club Grant

It was discussed that £1,000 be given to the Cricket Club upon completion of works. This was proposed by Chairman J Musgrove and seconded by Cllr T Fox and all agreed except for two Councillors who abstained as they are members of the Cricket Club.

6.11 Dates for Parish Meeting 2019

The Parish Office will be closed from 24th December to 3rd January. Therefore, the meeting in January will be moved to the 10th January to allow time for the Agenda to be published. The rest of the meetings in 2019 will be on the 1st Thursday of every month as normal.

6.12 Connect Magazine

Chairman J Musgrove has been informed that the Connect Magazine is now being produced by students at Iceni Academy under the current owner's control. The printer used to produce the magazine has been moved to the Iceni Academy. 1,000 copies will be produced for Mundford and the local villages.

However, due to the success of the leaflet produced for November the same group of people that produced the leaflet would like to continue doing so going forward into January followed by a new village magazine. A loan will be required from Mundford Parish Council to enable the magazine to get started. The suggestion is £1,000 to £1,500. This was agreed by all Councillors present.

6.13 Grass Cutting Contract

This will be discussed during the meeting in January.

An email was received from the Marketing Director of Enchanted Cinema which is an independent company based in Cambridge. At the HOSC meeting the Norwich Hospital Executives told us they have invested money to create more bed space in A&E and created a discharge lounge to prevent bed blocking.

Norfolk County Council has received extra money from the Government to assist with road repairs and it is already being put to good use.
