Minutes of the Mundford Parish Council Virtual Meeting by Zoom on 4th June 2020

1. THE CHAIRMAN'S OPENING REMARKS

Welcome to our first Zoom meeting. Our condolences to John Marston's relatives and close friends. Cllr D. Goodrham attended the funeral on our behalf. A wreath was sent from the Parish Council and is, along with other tributes, now on the John Marston football stand near Browns. The Clerk suggested we should dedicate the bench in Crown Road opposite the Parish Office to John. This bench is currently without a dedication. The Clerk and Cllr S. Welsh have arranged food parcels for the very vulnerable from Cost Cutters which are being delivered where necessary. The Clerk also has exercise packages for distribution to those who would like them.

Cllr B. Ellis (no excess to webcam). Cllr B. Ellis agreed with items at separate social distance meeting with the Chairman prior to the Zoom Meeting.

3. ACCEPT AND SIGN THE MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting in May were accepted as a true and accurate record. This was proposed by Cllr S. Booth and seconded by Cllr D. Goodrham. All agreed.

6. MATTERS ARISING

6.1 Annual Governance Statement 2019-2020

This was proposed by Cllr N. Enderby and seconded by Cllr D. Goodrham. All agreed.

6.3 Outstanding Highway Matters

- None of the proposed meetings with Highways have taken place. It appears that Swaffham Road has been surveyed ready for the proposed drainage works. Swaffham Road has been resurfaced and the Clerk has emailed Highways to get the excess stones swept following the heavy rain. (Clerk chased again and stones swept).
- The burst water main on Crown Road has been fixed. Clerk to email Highways to arrange for this part of the road to be resurfaced. (This has been done).
- There has been an increase in speeding traffic along Swaffham Road. Clerk to email the Police about this to see if the Speed Detection Team can visit and when a decision will be made for the Parish Partnership Scheme for the SAM2 signs. (This has been done).

6.4 Village Footpaths and Verges

- We need to ensure that Pig Stye Lane remains open during construction. There are construction vehicles being parked on the road outside Pig Stye Lane on a dangerous bend rather than on the construction site. Email to be sent to the Planning Department advising them of this. (This has been done).
- Didlington Nurseries have confirmed that there is a problem with supplying the full quantity of begonias for the various flower beds around the village. This is due to a general shortage of bedding plants. (Full quantities of begonias have subsequently arrived and have been planted by the handyman).

6.5 Allotments – to discuss (if any) outstanding or future matters

The allotments are in very good shape as many holders have time to spend on their allotments. The water tanks are filled twice a week by Chairman J. Musgrove.

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6.6 Handyman/Gardener – update on outstanding and future projects

All benches and bus shelters have been cleaned and general tidying and strimming around the village.

6.7 Allotment Hut

The allotment hut requires a lot of repair work to be carried out. When face to face meetings can resume, all Councillors will need to visit the allotments to discuss how to proceed.

6.8 Clerk - CiCLA

It was proposed by Chairman J. Musgrove and seconded by Cllr N. Enderby. All agreed.
